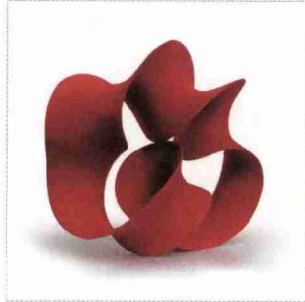
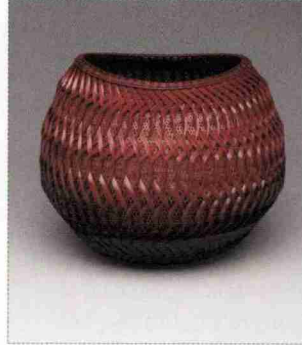


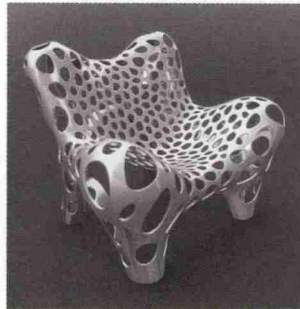
Object Lessons

THE NEW YORK edition of the Sculptural Objects and Functional Art Fair (SOFA) turns 15 this year at the Park Avenue Armory. Running from April 20–23, the fair, which is produced by The Art Fair Company, boasts 50 international dealers and a wide array of decorative arts.



TAI Gallery of Santa Fe will be offering a new series of bamboo and lacquer vases by Fujinuma Noboru, who recently exhibited his intricately woven bamboo work in a solo show at the Art Insti-

tute of Chicago. New York's Heller Gallery will be showing a plethora of glassware such as the natural history-like specimens of Steffan Dam, the celestial orbs of Jeannet Iskandar and the Scandinavian design-inspired Venetian blown glass cylinders of Tobias Mohl. Also exhibiting work will be Brooklyn's own Urban Glass, an experimental glass workshop that functions as the stu-



dio for over 350 glass artists and 900 students working with the medium each year.

Art jewelry will be represented at the fair, as well, with offerings from Charon Kransen Arts (New York), Ornamentum (Hudson, N.Y.) and Sienna Gallery (Lenox, Mass.). —A&A STAFF
